Campers: 27 booked, 25 arrived, one home on Wed pm due to illness.

This camp was successful in the gospel message clearly shared with all the campers through Sarah's Nemo-themed talks; and also messages for the leaders to continue to develop their faith and their leadership skills. There was a happy feel to the camp, with little in the way of disruption or behavioral issues. Several campers known to have problems coping at camp in the past continued to build confidence, and new campers settled in very well. The beach trip took a lot of planning, but was a huge success and is suggested for an activity for future CYC junior camps. Illness in the camp could have been a problem, but was managed well by the leaders. The camper who was sent home could perhaps be extended a part scholarship for a future camp at the discretion of the management.
